The Master's Entry Program in Nursing (MEPN) is intended for the student who has already earned a baccalaureate or higher degree in a discipline other than nursing. Upon completion of the program, students will be prepared to take the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX-RN) and graduate with both a certificate in Healthcare Administration and a Master of Science in Nursing. The MEPN program will provide the student with a solid foundation in nursing as well as master's level courses that will impart the necessary skills for their future success in key nursing leadership roles in healthcare.

The program is delivered over six consecutive 12-week terms, totaling 18 months. The program exceeds the minimum requirements of the New Hampshire Board of Nursing in classroom instruction and concurrent clinical practice hours for registered nurses. Master's level online courses will be woven throughout the program, reflecting the American Association of Colleges of Nursing's (AACN) Essentials of Master's Education in Nursing.

Upon completion of the MEPN program, students will be well-prepared to deliver high-quality and patient-centered nursing care in a variety of healthcare settings. Drawing upon their advanced knowledge from nursing and related disciplines, students will be poised to become collaborative leaders in the advancement of the nursing profession and improving patient outcomes.

- Official transcripts from previously attended colleges and universities
- Current resume
- Outline of professional aspirations and how the MEPN will help you achieve them (250-500 words)

ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENT CONSIDERATIONS

- Grade Point Average (GPA) 3.0 on a 4.0 scale.
- Non-nursing bachelor-level (or higher) degree
- ATI Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) admission exam (must have been taken within 1 year)
- Interview with nursing faculty (Virtual or in person)

PREREQUISITE COURSES

Students must complete the following courses with a letter grade of B or better prior to starting the MEPN program:

- High School or College Chemistry (lab required)
- Human Anatomy and Physiology I & II (lab required)
- Microbiology (lab required)
- Statistics
- Human/Lifespan Development
